Herr Segbers begrüßt alle Anwesende zu der außerordentlichen Sitzung des Institutsrats des Osteuropa-Instituts und kommuniziert den IR-Mitglieder, dass auf Grund von der Anwesenheit der internationalen Gästen, wird die Sitzung auf Englisch stattfinden.

Mr. Segbers welcomes the Department Council and the guests: Mrs. Annelli Soo from the Euro-College for historical reasons from the University in Tartu and Mr. Jouni Järvinen, director of education programs at the Aleksanteri Institute on the University in Helsinki. All attendees introduce themselves.

Ms Gerlach explains the history of the cooperation between the East European Institute, the Aleksanteri-Institute in Helsinki and the University in Tartu and there aims: an autumn school, furthermore a double degree program is planned, which involves all three partner-institutes.

The first autumn school should take place in October in Berlin and then switch in following years between the partner-universities. The topic of the autumn school will be "memory and identity" – the purpose is to keep it interdisciplinary. Mr Järvinen adjoins that the autumn school should not be based on the ordinary knowledge but encourage the students to go into details. There are approximately 20 students (7 from each university), mostly MA and doctorates (and some exceptions, like BA) students intended to join the school. Applications can be submitted from students with a background in social sciences or humanities. The application should involve a proof of proficiency in English, motivation letter, CV and an academic transcript of records. The selection of students will be based on these indicators; every institute has its own responsibility for the selection of students. Mr. Järvinen stressed that for this reason there should be only PhD teacher hired.

In terms of organization a coordinating committee will be established.

The members of the department council discuss the structure of the program of the autumn school. Summing up: most of the program units will have some input in the beginning, with enough time left for discussion. At the autumn school the students have to make a presentation, read papers, work in groups and actively participate in the lectures. For successful participation students are rewarded with a certificate with 5 ECTS points.

Afterwards Ms. Gerlach explained the finances of the project and points out that the cost should be divided by the three partners. The attendees discuss the possibilities to distribute the costs and to get some subsidies. It was proposed that the German side has to pay for the accommodation of the incoming students. The East European Institute will apply for co-financing at the Center of International Cooperation (CIC) and DAAD.
